



Royal Ballet School

The Royal Ballet School is a group of Grade I listed buildings dating from 1726 to 1990. The centrepiece is the Kings Pavilion constructed between 1726-1728 as a Royal hunting lodge. The crescent wings were added in 1801-1816 and it remained a royal residence until the 1930s. It has been occupied by the Royal Ballet School since 1954 and specialist extensions were added from 1955-1990.

In 2004 Watts drew up the detailed study of restoration and repair needs followed in 2006 and 2008/9 by quinquennial- twin five year rolling maintenance programmes and in 2010 by a detailed Historic Building Pathology investigation to solve long standing water ingress problems.
